Discipling Commission Request

Are you called to minister to the youngest newcomers in our congregation and their caregivers? Discipling Commission is seeking persons who feel called to minister to young families and infants ages birth to 3 in our nursery. So far, two persons from our congregation have indicated interest! We would like to have 2 additional people. This ministry would be to serve as a host for families that use the infant nursery. You would be present in the nursery to help meet the needs of young parents and provide care for their children when and if they are ready for that and be a companion to whoever is using the space. As a nursery host, you would make sure the space is well-stocked with extra diapers, wipes, snacks, and tissues and that it is comfortable and clean. You would check in with parents to see if they need you to watch their child while they use the restroom or get a drink. Your ministry would include regularly praying for young families and their children in the birth to 3 age range. We would prefer a person or team of persons to take a month at a time to serve in this role to establish continuity and trust. You're invited to prayerfully consider this opportunity. Oak Flat Ruling

On March 4, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals ruled on the case of Apache Stronghold v. U.S., voting 6-5 in favor of allowing the permanent destruction of Oak Flat, a sacred Indigenous site. Apache Stronghold has committed to appealing the ruling to the Supreme Court as a violation of religious freedom. Please keep this in your prayers. QPR Suicide Prevention Training

Three steps anyone can learn to help prevent suicide.



QPR is a suicide prevention training for participants to be able to recognize the warning signs of suicide and question, persuade, and refer people at risk for suicide for help. Key components covered in training:

- · How to Question, Persuade and Refer someone who may be suicidal
- · How to get help for yourself or learn more about preventing suicide
- · The common causes of suicidal behavior
- The warning signs of suicide
- How to get help for someone in crisis
