IMC Conference Report

Illinois Mennonite Conference (IMC) report from the March 9, 2024 session at Menno Haven. The annual session of IMC convened at Menno Haven on March 9, 2024. The opening session consisted of worship with Phil Kauffman as song leader, and Andrew Suderman, director of Global Partnerships at Mennonite Mission Network, as speaker. Mr. Suderman offered a very interesting presentation on seeds. Next were reports about special activities at two IMC churches. First Pastor Sergio from Sonido de Alabanza spoke of the work that they and others are doing with the large number of immigrants that are coming to Chicago area, directing them to available resources and, in particular, trying to meet the spiritual needs of the people they encounter. Second there was a report on the involvement of the Hopedale Mennonite Church with an immigrant family that is getting established in the Peoria area. Following lunch and reports from various Mennonite Agencies, the 2024 spending plan and IMC leadership teams were approved. The afternoon ended with a time of open discussion and questions. It was a very good IMC session.

Who is Jan Gleysteen, and how did he influence our church building?

Jan Gleysteen was an artist and historian who was born 1931 in Amsterdam, Netherlands. He eventually came to work at the Mennonite Publishing House in Scottdale, PA., where he did many illustrations for their publications. He was also one of the founders of TourMagination, which gave tours of Europe. Many toured Europe after World Conference using Jan's travel book and our family was happy to have a private 3 week tour of Europe in 2001. When it was decided that we would build a new church, Larry Jantze (church Chairperson) and Larry Reeser (building committee chairperson) were sent to a seminar at Laurelville, PA called "Caves to Catherals" by Jan Gleysteen, Leroy Troyer, and Paul Lederach. It was the story of our Anabaptist forefathers and how they did worship in Europe. We also had Jan come to our church and give his presentation on "Faith of our Fathers" and "Mennonite Meetingplaces." From these presentations we planned some aspects of the church we have today. Chairs instead of Pews to allow for different configurations. A wide sanctuary so the audience feels like they are part of the service. A large fellowship area in the tallest part of the church, because fellowship is important. No steeple, to allow the church to blend in with its surroundings. We called our building a Meetingplace instead of a church. That was changed in recent years.

Jan Gleysteen passed away at the age of 92 in December '23. His memorial service was on April 6, 2024 in Goshen, IND.


MC USA Executive Board affirms clean audit and new strategic plan
