### Widow's Cruse



### What food you can donate to your local food bank

Food banks accept dry and canned food donations (any food that is "shelf-stable" or nonperishable). Please only donate food that hasn't reached its "sell-by" date yet. Food banks often need items like:

- Peanut butter
- Canned soup
- Canned fruit
- Canned vegetables
- Canned stew
- Canned fish
- Canned beans
- Pasta (most prefer whole grain)
- Rice (most prefer brown rice)
- Personal care and household items

### MCC School Kits



This year through the end of August our church is again requesting school supplies for this project. Following is a list of supplies that need to be purchased for each bag. New

items only

- 4 spiral notebooks (70 sheets each. Can be wide lined or narrow). No more than 70 sheets each.
- 8 new UNSHARPENED pencils
- 1 ruler (good quality). Must indicate 30 cm in addition to inches
- 12 colored pencils (in packaging)
- 1 large eraser

We envision this site as a living archive, a place where members of the BMC community can come and engage the vibrant history of our LGBTQIA+ Anabaptist movement. <u>Read more in our official press release here</u>. Then join us for "Queering Our Anabaptist Archive," a BMC talk-back right after the webinar on July 24. Executive Director Annabeth Roeschley and Board Chair Xaris A. Martínez will share details about BMC's archival process, pictures of our move, and exciting ways to engage our living archive. We're excited to discuss how queer and trans archival work is a crucial part of activism today. Bring your questions and register for this virtual BMC event here.

Note: These are back-to-back events but have separate registrations. Recordings of both events will be posted on the BMC website, for those who aren't able to join us on July 24.

With our archives housed at Tretter, BMC claims the importance of telling our own story, told in connection with but not through a dominant religious institutional lens. This aligns with BMC's prophetic position as a grassroots organization flourishing on the margins of denominational space for nearly 50 years. The archives project been a years-long journey for our organization, made possible in consultation with BMC's board of directors, with the foresight and care of early BMC leaders and Brethren archivist Ken Shaffer, with the encouragement of the LGBTQ-RAN, and with financial support provided by a bequest from BMC ancestor Daniel "Joe" McRoberts (1940-2019).
