

This year through the end of August our church is again requesting school supplies for this project. Following is a list of supplies that need to be purchased for each bag. **New** 

items only

- 4 spiral notebooks (70 sheets each. Can be wide lined or narrow). No more than 70 sheets each.
- 8 new UNSHARPENED pencils
- 1 ruler (good quality). Must indicate 30 cm in addition to inches
- 12 colored pencils (in packaging)
- 1 large eraser
- 4 new black or blue ballpoint pens

Kits also include 1 small all metal pencil sharpener (one or two holes). DO NOT PURCHASE THIS ITEM AS IT WILL BE PROVIDED. They have been purchased in bulk from Amazon as they are hard to find in stores.

We envision this site as a living archive, a place where members of the BMC community can come and engage the vibrant history of our LGBTQIA+ Anabaptist movement. <u>Read more in our official press release here</u>. We'll be sharing this news more widely in the coming days, but wanted you to hear it first!

Come celebrate this accomplishment with BMC at two special events on July 24. Join BMC friend and LGBTQ Religious Archives Network archivist Doris Malkmus as she goes "Behind the Scenes at the Archives." This webinar will give you a chance to "tour" the back room of the Tretter Collection and hear from curator Aiden Bettine about how he builds relationships with donors, processes collections, and keeps them secure in subterranean stacks. Then join us for "Queering Our Anabaptist Archive," a BMC talk-back right after the webinar on July 24. Executive Director Annabeth Roeschley and Board Chair Xaris A. Martínez will share details about BMC's archival process, pictures of our move, and exciting ways to engage our living archive. We're excited to discuss how queer and trans archival work is a crucial part of activism today. Bring your questions and register for this virtual BMC event here.

Note: These are back-to-back events but have separate registrations. Recordings of both events will be posted on the BMC website, for those who aren't able to join us on July 24.

With our archives housed at Tretter, BMC claims the importance of telling our own story, told in connection with but not through a dominant religious institutional lens. This aligns with BMC's prophetic position as a grassroots organization flourishing on the margins of denominational space for nearly 50 years. The archives project been a years-long journey for our organization, made possible in consultation with BMC's board of directors, with the foresight and care of early BMC leaders and Brethren archivist Ken Shaffer, with the encouragement of the LGBTQ-RAN, and with financial support provided by a bequest from BMC ancestor Daniel "Joe" McRoberts (1940-2019).

A reflection on letting go. "Want to take your shoes off, Kadie?' My three-year old niece asks. She squats in front of me, tugging at one of my shoes. Phrases that I used at childhood playdates, pool parties, even church camps, float through my mind. I have Cerebral Palsy. I can't take off my shoes. My braces help me walk. This is the way God made me. 'This is the way God made me' was the line that I used when non-disabled children asked what happened to me, why I walked the way I did, or what those things were sticking out of my shoes.
