### It's Annual Evaluation Season!



**Background:** It's time for annual evaluations! Each year Vision Team (VT) and the Spiritual Gifts Discernment Team (SGDT) are responsible for leading the evaluation process of several groups within the church structure. Intending to minimize survey fatigue, VT and SGDT have teamed up to align the timelines and conduct as one process.

**What it is:** There are three annual evaluations we're seeking to complete:

- Evaluation of members of the Pastoral Team (conducted by VT)
- Evaluation of Vision Team (conducted by SGDT)
- Self-evaluation of Commissions and Teams (conducted by SGDT)

The first two evaluations are open to anyone from the congregation to complete. The third is intended for members of a commission or team to complete.

**How to complete:** There are two Google Forms that can be completed:

- Pastoral Team Evaluation
- Vision Team and Commission Evaluation

There will also be paper versions of the evaluations available to complete in the church office.

When to complete: As soon as you can! But we plan to have these surveys open for at least 3 weeks and start processing responses by August 15.

The Mennonite Church of Normal (MCN) is affiliated with two conferences: Illinois Mennonite Conference (IMC) and Central District Conference (CDC). In April of this year, IMC sent a proposal to their affiliated churches concerning credentialing practices and same sex marriage. After consultation between the Pastoral Team and Vision Team, MCN's response is as follows:

Mennonite<sup>'</sup> Church of Normal's (MCN's) affirmation of the dignity, marriage, and leadership of LGBTQ+ congregants is rooted in our commitment to Jesus and to the Bible. The Vision Team of MCN, in consultation with our Pastoral Team, has discerned that to agree with the current proposal put forth by Illinois Mennonite Conference (IMC) as written would undermine MCN's commitment to our vision and welcome statement. We will continue to engage in this discussion with IMC moving forward but do not support the proposal in its current form.

MCC School Kits



Last year Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) shipped 81,048 school kits to communities in Burundi, Chad, Ethiopia, Malawi, South Sudan, Ukraine, the U.S. and Zambia. Notebooks and pencils are treasures for families who struggle to access or afford school supplies. MCC school kits are often requested after disasters as they help bring a sense of normalcy to children whose families have been forced to flee their homes.

This year through the end of August our church is again requesting school supplies for this project. Following is a list of supplies that need to be purchased for each bag. **New items only** 

- 4 spiral notebooks (70 sheets each. Can be wide lined or narrow). No more than 70 sheets each.
- 8 new UNSHARPENED pencils
- 1 ruler (good quality). Must indicate 30 cm in addition to inches
- 12 colored pencils (in packaging)
- 1 large eraser
- 4 new black or blue ballpoint pens

Kits also include 1 small all metal pencil sharpener (one or two holes). DO NOT PURCHASE THIS ITEM AS IT WILL BE PROVIDED. They have been purchased in bulk from Amazon as they are hard to find in stores.

There are bags provided in back of the sanctuary for you to take home and fill or you can also just bring the supplies in a store plastic bag and we will place them in a cloth bag for you. Thanks so much for your participation in this project. This project will run through the end of August at which time the supplies will be collected and distributed to a MCC drop off location.



After an 11-day, 141-mile journey, our "All God's Children March for a Ceasefire" concluded on Sunday afternoon outside the White House. More than 125 people joined the final 8-mile leg of the march on Sunday. As we walked through the streets of downtown DC, we prayed, sang, and carried banners and signs calling on our elected officials to stop supporting the genocide in Gaza. Together, we demonstrated our Christian and Mennonite solidarity with the people of Palestine. Our feet are tired from marching. But our spirits are lifted by coming together in beloved community to live out the central tenets of our faith. Our love must extend to all of God's children, and that's why we need our lawmakers to support a permanent ceasefire now. Every step of our long journey to the White House, our hearts have been with the people of Gaza who have suffered so much from attacks with weapons of war supplied by our own government.
