MCC School Kits



Last year Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) shipped 81,048 school kits to communities in Burundi, Chad, Ethiopia, Malawi, South Sudan, Ukraine, the U.S. and Zambia. Notebooks and pencils are treasures for families who struggle to access or afford school supplies. MCC school kits are often requested after disasters as they help bring a sense of normalcy to children whose families have been forced to flee their homes.

This year through the end of August our church is again requesting school supplies for this project. Following is a list of supplies that need to be purchased for each bag. **New items only**

- 4 spiral notebooks (70 sheets each. Can be wide lined or narrow). No more than 70 sheets each.
- 8 new UNSHARPENED pencils
- 1 ruler (good quality). Must indicate 30 cm in addition to inches
- 12 colored pencils (in packaging)
- 1 large eraser
- 4 new black or blue ballpoint pens

Kits also include 1 small all metal pencil sharpener (one or two holes). DO NOT PURCHASE THIS ITEM AS IT WILL BE PROVIDED. They have been purchased in bulk from Amazon as they are hard to find in stores.

There are bags provided in back of the sanctuary for you to take home and fill or you can also just bring the supplies in a store plastic bag and we will place them in a cloth bag for you. Thanks so much for your participation in this project. This project will run through the end of August at which time the supplies will be collected and distributed to a MCC drop off location.

It's Annual Evaluation Season!



Background: It's time for annual evaluations! Each year Vision Team (VT) and the Spiritual Gifts Discernment Team (SGDT) are responsible for leading the evaluation process of several groups within the church structure. Intending to minimize survey fatigue, VT and SGDT have teamed up to align the timelines and conduct as one process.

What it is: There are three annual evaluations we're seeking to complete:

- Evaluation of members of the Pastoral Team (conducted by VT)
- Evaluation of Vision Team (conducted by SGDT)
- Self-evaluation of Commissions and Teams (conducted by SGDT)

The first two evaluations are open to anyone from the congregation to complete. The third is intended for members of a commission or team to complete.

How to complete: There are two Google Forms that can be completed:

- Pastoral Team Evaluation
- Vision Team and Commission Evaluation

There will also be paper versions of the evaluations available to complete in the church office.

When to complete: As soon as you can! But we plan to have these surveys open for at least 3 weeks and start processing responses by August 15.

Ableism holds that people with disabilities are in need of "fixing" and defines people solely by their disability. Restoration Retreat


November 1-3 at Camp Friedenswald

Volunteers repair massive water damage at school

Mennonite Disaster Service (MDS) volunteers visited Kykotsmovi Village on the Hopi Reservation in Arizona, and helped repair extensive water damage at the Peace Academic Center. After a November 2023 freeze, Lance Polingyouma, superintendent of the center, was facing an immense repair job, describing the walls of the school as "an entire waterfall." MDS volunteer Tom Mosier, who lives in Show Low, Arizona—about a two-and-a-half-hour drive from the school—got word of the damage from MDS regional operations leadership. He knew he had to see the school for himself. "It was a short-notice project," described Tom, who promptly became the project director—his first time in that role—then recruited several more volunteers from the region.
