When you come for anointing, you may receive the sign of the cross with oil on your forehead or back of their hand. If you wish, you may share with the person doing the anointing something for which you a praying for healing – for yourself, for someone else or for the world.

Reiman Family Laura Ingalls Wilder presentation

Sunday, Sept 29 at 5:00 PM at the MRC Community Building

Reiman Family Laura Ingalls Wilder presentation: People of all ages welcome. Between 1870 and 1894, Laura Ingalls traversed the midwestern states of Wisconsin, Kansas, Minnesota, South Dakota, Iowa, and Missouri in a covered wagon. The Reimans covered most of that territory in eight days this past summer, pulling their cozy camper behind. Leading up to this journey, 9-year-old Adah had read all of the books (except Farmer Boy) and seen most of the television series. Along the journey, Amy listened to the audiobook of the Pulitzer winning biography, *Prairie Fires: The American Dreams of Laura Ingalls Wilder*, by Caroline Fraser. Jeff, not having read the books and only having seen a few of the episodes, created one of his finest vacation spreadsheets of all times, and in so doing, helped craft an immersive vacation for the two Laura Fan Girls. Juan Montes named executive director of Iglesia Menonita Hispana

The board of directors of Iglesia Menonita Hispana (IMH, translated Hispanic Mennonite Church), a constituency group of Mennonite Church USA, appointed Rev. Dr. Juan Montes as executive director during the IMH annual meeting on April 6, 2024, in Chicago, Illinois. Montes is the pastor of <u>Primera Iglesia Menonita</u> in Reedley, California, a position he has held for 31 years. "Pastor Juan Montes is the ideal candidate to serve as 'director ejecutivo' of IMH and to lead the growth of the Hispanic church in the United States," said IMH Moderator Josué González, citing Montes' pastoral and leadership experience, as well as his previous service to IMH. **Read more from Mennonite Church USA** here (en español).

Master's program in conflict transformation ignites vision for justice/peace in Benin

Fernand Kpossilande has been intrigued by the concept of conflict transformation for as long as he can remember. So, when he heard about the master's degree offered by <u>Le Centre Formation Justice & Paix</u> (CFJP, Justice and Peace Training Center), he said that he felt like God had answered his prayers. Mennonite Mission Network, through many partners in Africa, Europe and North America, helped conceive the CFJP program and has deeply invested in nurturing this partnership of 15 theological schools and institutions that make up the program and offer online courses informed by Anabaptist theology for the French-speaking world. **Read more from Mennonite Mission Network here**.

"Since the 1980s, Turkey and Iran have conducted military operations in northern Iraq, purportedly targeting various armed non-state opposition Kurdish groups, such as the Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) and its affiliated armed groups, as well as the Kurdistan Democratic Party of Iranian Kurdistan (KDP-I).
