How does someone make such a shift aside from such a dramatic intervention? How do we "find ourselves," or change our self-perception enough that we feel worthy of God's calling for us?





# How to Challenge Christian Nationalism: Building Peace in an Age of Extremism

On Oct. 8, AMBS Associate Professor Drew Strait, PhD, gave a public lecture in South Bend, Indiana, sharing insights from his new book, Strange Worship: Six Steps for Challenging Christian Nationalism (Cascade, 2024).
