

# The Doctrine of Discovery is at work in the U.S.A.

"In the <u>Tonto National Forest</u> of central Arizona, Chi'chil Biłdagoteel, ("Oak Flat" in English) is a region of immense cultural, ecological and historical significance. Renowned for its unique geological formations and diverse flora and fauna, it holds deep significance for multiple Indigenous communities. Located 70 miles east of Phoenix, Arizona, Oak Flat has been home to San Carlos Apache's ancestors for centuries, if not millennia. The Apache Nation is believed to have migrated to the American Southwest from the north, possibly crossing the Bering Land Bridge thousands of years ago.
