What does it mean to provide sanctuary for undocumented people?

Wednesday, Feb. 5, 2025 at 6 pm Central Time

What does it mean to provide sanctuary for undocumented people? This webinar on Feb. 5, 2025, at 7 p.m. ET/4 p.m. PT, will feature several pastors whose congregations have previously served as sanctuaries. Lawyers from the Institute of Constitutional Advocacy and Protection will discuss the legal issues related to sanctuary, specifically focusing on section 1324, and will allow time for participants to ask questions. For churches that are currently working with or are interested in supporting undocumented individuals in their communities, this webinar will provide crucial information on what to expect and what legal assistance is available if your church faces challenges from ICE or immigration agents. **Learn more and register here.**

Brethren in Christ churches in Cuba use MCC supplies to help neighbors

"The people of Cuba were already dealing with an economic recession and ongoing recovery from a previous hurricane when Hurricane Oscar flooded parts of the east side of the island in October. Hurricane Rafael then rampaged on Cuba's western side in November followed by an earthquake in the west. Electricity, which is normally only available three hours a day, went out completely before Hurricane Oscar came, says Bishop Luis Hernández of the Brethren in Christ (BIC) Church in Cuba. Without electricity, people did not have information about the storm, leaving them unprepared when the hurricane lashed the island. Currently the church is distributing canned meat and hygiene supplies that were prepositioned in the country. A new shipment of MCC supplies is waiting to clear customs in Cuba. Another was being packed at the MCC East Coast Material Resources Center in Ephrata, Pennsylvania, when Hernández and his wife, Yanaisy Marrero, visited in mid November." **Read the rest of Linda Espenshade's article for Mennonite Central Committee (MCC)** here.

Compassion House welcomes refugees

"It took many hands and many hearts to build the Compassion House. The single family home, property of the Lancaster (Pa.) Brethren in Christ Church, is the fruitful result of a partnership between Mennonite Disaster Service (MDS), Mennonite Central Committee (MCC), and Church World Service (CWS). A family from Afghanistan moved into the newly renovated home at the end of November after resettling to Lancaster earlier in the month. Everence is expanding its hurricane recovery matching gift initiative in response to the generosity of its members and community. Departing from Palestine isn't as simple as booking a flight and heading to the airport. MC USA Executive Board commits to prioritizing historical BIPOC narratives; Sets direction for new structure review task group

At its meeting on Nov. 14-16, 2024, in Destin, Florida, the Mennonite Church USA (MC USA) Executive Board affirmed a call from the denomination's Racial Ethnic Council (REC) to increase awareness of the historical record of BIPOC Mennonites and to fund BIPOC contributions to the MC USA Archives.
