



## What does it mean to provide sanctuary for undocumented people?

### Wednesday, Feb. 5, 2025 at 6 pm Central Time

What does it mean to provide sanctuary for undocumented people? This webinar on Feb. 5, 2025, at 7 p.m. ET/4 p.m. PT, will feature several pastors whose congregations have previously served as sanctuaries. Lawyers from the Institute of Constitutional Advocacy and Protection will discuss the legal issues related to sanctuary, specifically focusing on section 1324, and will allow time for participants to ask questions. For churches that are currently working with or are interested in supporting undocumented individuals in their communities, this webinar will provide crucial information on what to expect and what legal assistance is available if your church faces challenges from ICE or immigration agents. # #This Is Welcome

The Trump administration has already begun to conduct mass deportations of immigrants, and to curtail legal immigration pathways like asylum and parole. A <u>slew of executive orders</u> signed immediately after inauguration will attempt to end birthright citizenship, punish sanctuary cities, send military troops to the border, and otherwise restrict immigration. We expect to see an increase in family separation, racial discrimination, and other harmful conditions. Congress has already <u>passed anti-immigrant legislation</u> as well, making detention of migrants accused of minor crimes mandatory. With this context in mind, how should Christians respond?

As Jesus says in Matthew 25:40 (NIV), "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." Later in verse 43, Jesus continues, "I was a stranger and you did not invite me in, I needed clothes and you did not clothe me, I was sick and in prison and you did not look after me."

The Interfaith Immigration Coalition (IIC), of which MCC U.S. is a longstanding member, invites people of faith to sign a petition expressing support for policies that welcome the sojourner, including:

- Safeguard the right to seek protection from persecution;
- Manage our nation's borders humanely, transparently, and responsibly;
- Provide opportunities for people to immigrate to the U.S.;
- Ensure individuals can remain with their families without fear of deportation and apply for citizenship; and
- Respect and protect human rights and work for peace globally to prevent forced migration and displacement.

This petition will be sent to members of Congress to demonstrate widespread support for welcoming immigrants and refugees in need. Please be on the lookout for other opportunities to contact your members of Congress or meet with their staff directly throughout the year. **Sign the petition here**.
