Civil Rights Trips

Information about upcoming Civil Rights trips from Pastor Kathy King-Nobles (Normal First United Methodist Church):

Both of these trips will basically follow the same itinerary used for the previous two Civil Rights Trips (2023 & 2024), with stops in Memphis, Birmingham, Montgomery, and Selma. In addition, there will be gatherings before each trip in order that group members can get to know each other, study the Civil Rights movement and its history, and learn more about the places we'll visit.

- **Fall 2025 trip** Our United Methodist Conference (IGRC) is hosting a Civil Rights Trip this fall, October 2-10, 2025. Information and Registration is available <u>here</u>. Deadline to register is June 30. Pre-trip meetings will begin after Easter. I am working with Curt Franklin (Coordinator of Missions & Outreach) to organize this trip. We will be co-leaders on the trip.
- **Spring 2026 trip** Normal First United Methodist will be hosting the Civil Rights Trip next spring, April 16-24, 2026. Registrations will open this summer. I will be leading this trip in partnership with other faith leaders from Bloomington-Normal.


Join the Financial Planning Group

We write to you holding all of the fear and anxiety that this moment brings — as deportations of of our undocumented neighbors increase, as our trans loved ones are targeted, as the genocide in Palestine continues. We hold all of this with you. This week, the abduction of Mahmoud Khalil — a U.S. permanent resident and student organizer for Palestinian rights — left us particularly angry and despairing. The Trump administration is showing us they will not hesitate to use our country's carceral and deportation systems as weapons against those speaking up against genocide and occupation. Amidst all of this heaviness, Mennonite Action will continue to offer a public witness: to show our communities that there are Mennonites and Christians who say no to rising far-right Christian Nationalism. We will continue to be a Beloved Community for those taking action for peace and justice. And we will continue to stand up in our communities and say that we will not be afraid to follow Jesus's call to always side with the oppressed, even in these uncertain and often frightening times.

Cost: \$2,500, includes transportation in South Africa, lodging, meals and entrance fees. The optional safari is an additional \$1,000.


July 13-19 | Register by June 1

Occupation: the beginning, the end, and everything in-between

"After the ceasefire agreement between Hamas and Israel, the announcement of the release of hostages and Palestinian prisoners brought happiness beyond words. These prisoners, who have spent years locked in small rooms, some up to 35 years, endured a significant part of their lives behind bars. I was born, lived, and built my life – going to university, and making plans – but someone else spent those same years in prison. During the second prisoner exchange, my cousin was one of them! MCC Action Alert: Rising violence in the West Bank

Respond to rising violence in the West Bank

Background: In the midst of a fragile ceasefire in Gaza, settler violence, Israeli military bombings and displacement continue to increase in the West Bank. On January 21, days after the Gaza ceasefire was announced, Israel launched an offensive in the northern part of the West Bank which included airstrikes. The offensive has displaced over 45,000 Palestinians from refugee camps, exceeding any other displacement since the 1967 War. A few days later, under the protection of the Israeli military, settlers were able to rampage through surrounding towns in the area of the Israeli military and settler violence has killed at least 44 Palestinians, caused widespread destruction to homes and infrastructure (roads and commercial buildings), and has increasingly targeted medical services. Additionally, the movement of Palestinians in the West Bank has been further restricted. This is a critical moment to urge the U.S. Congress and the Trump administration to:

- Return to pressuring Israel to stop settler violence and illegal settlements on Palestinian land.
- Increase humanitarian assistance to the region rather than halting it.
- Push for a permanent ceasefire in Gaza.
- Fully fund UNRWA and press Israel to allow UNRWA to operate in Gaza and the West Bank, including East Jerusalem.
