Huckabee believes that all the armies of the world will battle in Israel (Armageddon), bringing about the Rapture and the Return of Christ. Bluffton University has played a very important part in the lives of many in this congregation. We met our spouse there, we made lifelong friends, we learned our vocation, and we learned how to live a life of service to others. Bluffton is where we grew into responsible adults.

This past week has been one full of change for Bluffton University. Our president resigned, effective immediately. An interim president has been named. His name is Dr. J. Alexander Sider. He has served the college since 2006 as Professor of Religion and most recently Vice President of Academic Affairs and Academic Dean. The Board and Faculty are supportive of this appointment and look for to working with Dr. Sider.

We then received notice that the University of Findlay, who Bluffton had spent considerable time working with as partners, exploring ways we could benefit each other, had decided this was not working for them, and canceled this collaboration. Bluffton is now, once again on their own.

Meanwhile, a group of Bluffton grads created a Bluffton College Foundation. Two of the founding families have strong ties and have attended Normal Mennonite.

Urge Congress to protect clean energy tax credits

Background: An upcoming budget bill in Congress threatens to cut popular clean energy tax credits to pay for expanded tax cuts and increased immigration enforcement. Federal tax credits for energy efficiency in homes were instituted with bipartisan support in 2005, saving households money on energy bills and reducing energy use. In recent years, two major pieces of legislation allocated tax credits on solar panels, wind energy and electric vehicles—incentives now in jeopardy. Clean energy tax credits are creating tens of thousands of jobs, meeting rapidly growing energy needs, reducing the strain on the energy grid, and saving households and non-profits money. By 2024, more than 2,500 houses of worship had solar panels. By 2030, these tax credits, along with other Inflation Reduction Act programs, could help reduce overall emissions by 30-43% below 2005 levels. Repealing the tax credits would mean the loss of over \$300 billion in private investment in the clean energy sector and close to 100,000 jobs over the next 15 years. Additionally, clean energy projects that have already broken ground, such as battery production plants, could be canceled.

Dear friends of The Immigration Project, We are relieved that the federal grant freeze has been rescinded, allowing us to continue providing critical legal services. This is a significant win, but we remain mindful that funding uncertainties could still impact our programs in the future. Take this story of Claudia who came to TIP in April 2024 needing legal representation, social services support, and therapy services, while grappling with PTSD, anxiety, depression, and the aftereffects of being a victim of domestic violence. Thanks to a federal grant, we were able to assign her an attorney who has been diligently advocating for her rights. By July, Claudia also began her journey in therapy services. Throughout the past 6 months, we have watched Claudia demonstrate admirable strength, resilience, and determination as she continues to grow, heal, and flourish. Team with transgender athlete refuses to play B.C. college after alleging abuse

The Vancouver Island University women's basketball team refused to play a pair of games against Mennonite-affiliated Columbia Bible College in January because of alleged verbal and physical mistreatment of a transgender teammate by Columbia's coach and players in October. Vancouver player Harriette Mackenzie, who is transgender, said Columbia coach Taylor Claggett went on a "tirade" after losing on Oct. 25, yelling about how Mackenzie shouldn't be allowed to play against women, The Associated Press reported. Mackenzie said her opponents physically targeted her when the teams played again Oct. 26. In a statement, CBC officials said "accusations that CBC, its coaches, players and fans are a safety threat are simply untrue and misinformed." Located in Abbotsford, B.C., CBC is affiliated with Mennonite Church British Columbia and the British Columbia Mennonite Brethren. Read the Anabaptist World article here.

The U.S. military complex is terrifying

"In 2020, Canada witnessed the <u>Nova Scotia attacks</u> in which 23 people were killed between April 18 and 19. This remains the largest massacre in Canada <u>since 1972</u>. Within two weeks Prime Minister Justin Trudeau announced an immediate ban on over 1,500 models and variants of assault-style firearms. Two months later, my family moved from Calgary, Alberta, in Canada, to Harrisonburg, Va., in the United States. I was adjusting to a new country amid a global pandemic. One of the biggest culture shocks was the difference in the ways Canada and the U.S. view guns, assault weapons and the military. As a lifelong Mennonite and pacifist, I have always wrestled with how to approach the military complex in whichever country I live in. I often recall phrases like, "Make borscht, not bombs," and my all-time favorite Mennonite Central Committee tank top that said, 'This is how Mennonites bare arms.' Even when attending Mennonite schools and existing in majority Mennonite circles, there were still several moments that stuck with me." Read the rest of Mackenzie P.
