"Last call" for Vision Team Nominations



Shelly's term as Vision Team Chair ends on December 31, 2025. She will be stepping down from the Vision Team at that time. Members of the congregation need to nominate a chair-elect (Ministry Description summary) now who will join Vision Team in June, moving into the position of chair on January 1, 2026. This new member will join Shelly for the remainder of her term, Shannon, Ben, and Helen on the Team. The Spiritual Gifts Discernment Team (SGDT) is responsible for organizing the nomination and election processes for filling this position.

The process:

- Apr. 27–May 7 Nominations for Vision Team chair-elect are submitted.
 - May 8 SGDT prepares a slate of candidates including the names of the 5 people who received the most nominations. *
- May 11 Election slate announced.
- May 11–14 Ballots are submitted. (Paper ballots and online voting available.)
 - May 15 SGDT reviews the ballots. The person receiving the most votes is contacted and invited to prayerfully discern this call. If that person declines, If that person does not feel called to this role at this time, SGDT will discern who to call next.

*One may not request that their name be removed from the slate. We want the Spirit to speak through the congregation in this process. You may not want to serve, but if the congregation calls you, we want you to prayerfully consider it. And if at that point it still does not coincide with your sense of call, it is appropriate to decline.

News from First Menno CU



Inspired by the "Medical Debt Jubilee" campaign we participated in during 2023, First Mennonite Church of Champaign-Urbana led a similar campaign this year as a part of their yearlong celebration of Anabaptism's 500 years under the theme "jubilee." They were able to raise \$52,333 which was used to completely eliminate all of the medical debt in the 14 Central Illinois counties (including McLean County) along with 4 other counties where they had not planned to have an impact—purchasing and forgiving a total of more than 8 million dollars! Petition to promote peace in Haiti

The humanitarian situation in Haiti is dire and worsening every day. Over 85% of the capital city, Port-au-Prince, is controlled by armed gangs and the territory they hold continues to expand. Haitians face many challenges, including indiscriminate violence, kidnappings, food insecurity and gender-based violence. Despite this context, Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) partners persist in serving their communities and building peace in Haiti. The illegal trafficking of weapons from the United States has exacerbated these challenges, empowered gangs, and made the work of MCC partners more difficult and dangerous. There are concrete ways the U.S. government can act to reduce violence, such as by preventing weapons and ammunition from reaching Haiti, immediately limiting the gangs' power. The Quixote Center, Mennonite Central Committee U.S., and many other faith-based groups with ties to Haiti are circulating a petition addressed to Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem, urging her to prevent further harm and injustice in Haiti.

The petition asks for the following:

- Screen more ships leaving Miami and going to Haiti
- Issue an executive order preventing weapons and ammunition from reaching gangs and cartels
- Increase recovery and tracing of weapons in Haiti for research purposes
- Initiate interagency collaboration to stop illegal weapons trafficking
- Extend Temporary Protected Status to Haitians and stop deportations

Update from Mennonite Actoin

We witness with broken hearts the intensifying military operations in Gaza, as Israeli forces continue to blockade humanitarian aid and prepare for an escalated ground offensive. We are crying out for justice and praying for peace. And we are also taking action. We are standing up for a different path in Palestine, and for a new world of liberation, alongside the hundreds of members of Mennonite Action who are moved to speak out in this moment. We do not do this work alone. Surrounded by so much suffering and death, we hold fast to the community around us that nurtures and sustains us. Together, we continue to lift our voices for Gaza and for all of God's children. We know our God is weeping with us. - God's Love Knows No Borders Actions: Mennonite Action chapters across North America continue to plan and hold public worship services to proclaim that God's love is not limited by nationality or border. Hundreds of Mennonites and allies have recently taken action in the Twin Cities, MN, Baltimore, MD, Pasadena, CA, and Newton, KS. The group of participants in the Pasadena action, which took place on Easter Sunday, changed the lyrics to one of the stanzas of a popular Easter hymn to sing: "ICE cannot keep its prey Jesus, my Savior! He tore the bars away Jesus, my Lord!"
- New Episode Of Front Light Podcast: Don't miss the latest episode of Mennonite Action's podcast, Front Light, featuring Michael George a Palestinian-American Christian currently serving on the steering committees of Mennonite Action and the Mennonite Palestine Israel Network (MennoPIN). Michael helps facilitate MennoPIN's "Twinning with Gaza" initiative in which Mennonite congregations in the United States have built relationships with Palestinian-led nonprofit organizations in Gaza.

Urge Congress to increase the budget for foreign assistance

Background: On May 2, the White House released <u>President Trump's fiscal year (FY) 2026 budget request</u> outlining the administration's agenda. The budget includes a 13% increase in military spending and would eliminate funding for several life-saving foreign assistance programs, including the Complex Crisis Fund and the Food for Peace program. <u>Previous cuts to U.S. foreign assistance</u> are already having severe impacts on vulnerable communities around the world. Unless funding is restored, we will see increases in trauma, famine and food insecurity that will likely lead to millions of deaths. This is the time for Congress to push back on the White House proposal and legislate a morally responsible FY2026 budget. The world today faces unprecedented challenges: a rise in violent conflicts globally, massive forced displacements, growing food insecurity and looming famines. According to the <u>Global Hunger Index</u>, 42 countries are already experiencing alarming levels of hunger. <u>Recent funding cuts</u> by the U.S. and other nations have increased the risks for violence, hunger and deaths. Urge your members of Congress to recognize our moral responsibility and prioritize assistance for vulnerable populations.

Faith reflection: In the Scriptures, Jesus repeatedly reminds us of our responsibility toward each other, especially in responding to basic needs and saving lives, describing how God blesses and rewards those who are compassionately generous to others (Matthew 25: 31-45).

- Earlier this month, a small group of Anabaptists gathered around the conference table in MCC's Washington, D.C., office. Along with a dozen participants on Zoom, they prayerfully prepared to speak with congressional staff about protecting clean energy tax credits and urban forest grants. Some shared that raising their voice in a context that is hostile to climate policy felt futile. Yet, the advocates were clear that climate change is not something to be managed as individuals. Government policy is an essential mechanism for collective practices that can heal the planet. According to Kate Knuth, climate director of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency and former Minnesota state representative, "The work of our time is to reweave the fabric of our democracy even as the broken systems seem overwhelming, even as the work we each can do feels so small. It's time for an intentional practice of climate citizenship." **Take action:** Protect clean energy tax incentives.
