

Congregational Vote

Sunday, June 29

There will be a congregational vote on June 29 regarding these two items:

- With consideration of the church vision and feedback and discussion within the congregation, Vision Team proposes that Mennonite Church of Normal (MCN) discontinue its dual conference status, withdraw its membership from Illinois Mennonite Conference (IMC), and continue its membership with Central District Conference (CDC) only. If approved, the exact timing and process of withdrawing membership from IMC would be determined over the coming months to help ensure a fair, responsible, and respectful exit.
- In a separate measure, Vision Team recommends that MCN add \$8,000 funding to our 2025 budget to support IMC for the remainder of this year. (Currently, only \$8,000 was approved in the spending plan which is half of the \$16,000 annual contribution determined by a percentage of our spending plan.) *Please see the document below for more information on the current status of our budget to consider before you vote on this.

There will be a potluck meal on June 29 following the CE hour (see separate post for more details), and then a time for discussion before the voting opens. The Vision Team continues to update the Information and Discussion Notes (linked here) with your questions, comments, and feedback. A letter to MC USA members from Moderator Jon Carlson re: Mosaic Mennonite Conference process

"Dear Mennonite Church USA, I'm writing to share an update with you about the ongoing conversation between Mosaic Mennonite Conference and the MC USA Executive Board. Over the past several years, Executive Board leaders and staff have spent significant time engaging with Mosaic leaders, in honor of our longstanding relationships and our appreciation of the many gifts that Mosaic congregations bring to the broader MC USA community. We have tried to listen deeply to Mosaic's concerns and frustrations, recognizing that 'If one member suffers, all suffer together with it' (1 Cor. 12:26)." **Read the rest of Moderator Jon Carlson's letter** here.

Mosaic, MC USA decline each other's proposals

Conference board turns down denominational board's offer of a mediated conversation. After declining each other's proposals about affiliation and process, leaders of Mennonite Church USA and Mosaic Mennonite Conference offered explanations and expressed regrets. Mosaic, which is reassessing its affiliation with the denomination, had proposed to become a program-entity partner rather than a member conference. On May 8, the MC USA Executive Board responded that this was "not viable within our structure" and offered a mediated conversation. The Mosaic board declined the offer "at this time." "John Linscheid accepted an apology from Western District Conference of Mennonite Church USA on May 11 at Peace Mennonite Church in Lawrence, Kan., 41 years after the conference rescinded his ministerial credential because he is gay. The service of repentance and restoration marked the second time an MC USA conference has restored the ministerial credentials of an LGBTQ+ minister. Mennonite Action June Mass Call

Dear Friends,

While today, many Pride month celebrations are <u>sponsored by weapons</u> <u>manufacturers</u>, Pride has its origins in an uprising against state violence. Our queer elders and trans-cesters who refused to go quietly into police wagons outside the Stonewall Inn, in the early hours of June 28, 1969, understood their <u>protest as inseparable from protests</u> against racist policing at home and US militarism abroad. And, like Jesus throughout the Gospels, they knew that protest and witness can also be beautiful and spectacular. Pride month reminds us that God's house has many, many rooms. God holds all of who we are: Our beauty, our spectacle, our grief, and our protest. Or, as <u>Al Qaws for Sexual & Gender Diversity in Palestinian Society</u> puts it, "That there will be a place for all of us at the rendezvous of victory."

On **Thursday, June 26, our** monthly mass call will sit at the intersection of Queer and Palestinian liberation, featuring a panel of LGBTQ organizers that includes queer Palestinians. Together, we will reflect on the power of memory and imagination, because queer organizing has always combined grieving the dead with imagining a new and freer Kin-dom of God. If you are hungry for space to grieve and radically imagine a world free from Christian nationalism and Christian Zionism, you don't want to miss it!

Queer and trans Palestinians understand that their freedom as queer people is inseparable from freedom for their land and people (and sometimes, they get tired of reminding the rest of us). They have repeatedly called out how Israel's claim to be a haven for queer people functions to hide anti-Palestinian violence (a practice called "pinkwashing."). And they have been joined by LGBTQ+ people around the world who have built and led Palestine solidarity organizations. This includes Mennonite Action, where queer people were featured on our very first mass call and have continued to be involved at every level since. Our opposition to Christian Nationalism is in the name of Palestinians, migrants, and queer and trans people. Our collective liberation is all tied together, and we refuse to be pinned against one another. As we continue to mourn the dead in Gaza and organize for peace and justice for all God's people, let us not surrender the truly radical vision that springs from our faith:

they shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation; neither shall they learn war any more; but they shall all sit under their own vines and under their own fig trees, and no one shall make them afraid.

Measles outbreak claims life in Mexico

"A Mennonite man in Mexico died April 3 from complications related to measles as documented cases in Mexico climbed over 920. Health officials believe the actual count is far higher. The Associated Press reported health officials traced the Mexico outbreak to an 8-year-old unvaccinated Mennonite boy who visited relatives in Seminole, Texas, and then returned to Mexico in March. The man who died was a 31-year-old from Camello Colony near Cuauhtemoc. The AP did not report his vaccination status, but he had diabetes and high blood pressure, which can complicate the body's ability to respond to the virus. *Die Mennonitische Post* carried a death notice." **Read the rest of the Anabaptist World article** here.

Urge Congress to protect lifesaving humanitarian assistance

Background: On May 30, the White House sent a detailed document to Congress, requesting additional funding cuts to lifesaving humanitarian assistance. The document fleshes out the previously released FY2026 budget request which includes a 13% increase in military spending and the elimination of vital programs such as Food for Peace. These cuts will result in catastrophic outcomes, including otherwise preventable deaths, as well as increased global poverty, instability and violence. For decades, a bipartisan majority in Congress recognized that foreign assistance brings more peaceful and prosperous communities globally—and in the U.S. Previous cuts to U.S. foreign assistance are already having severe impacts on vulnerable communities around the world. Unless funding is restored, we will see increases in trauma, famine and food insecurity, leading to millions of deaths. This week, the Senate begins deliberations on the FY26 budget bill passed by the House. Urge your Senators to recognize our moral responsibility and to unconditionally prioritize assistance for vulnerable populations.

Faith reflection: In the Scriptures, Jesus repeatedly reminds us of our responsibility toward each other, especially in responding to basic needs and saving lives, describing how God blesses and rewards those who are compassionately generous to others (Matthew 25:31-45). God invites us to courageously love others and share generously, in the same way God loves us.
