

## Dual Conference Affiliation Vote

The following are the results of this week's congregational vote on the two recommendations submitted by the Vision Team.

- The first recommendation, "...that Mennonite Church of Normal (MCN) discontinue its dual conference status, **withdraw its membership from Illinois Mennonite Conference (IMC)**, and continue its membership with Central District Conference (CDC) only," **passed with 88% of the vote** (67% was required to pass). The exact timing and process of withdrawing membership from IMC will be determined over the coming months to help ensure a fair, responsible, and respectful exit.
- The second recommendation, "...that MCN **add \$8,000 funding** to our 2025 budget to support IMC for the remainder of this year," **did not pass with 57% of the vote** (67% was required to pass).






## MCC U.S. National Peace & Justice Ministries: Policy Updates

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- **Travel Ban 2.0:** on June 4, the Trump administration announced travel restrictions for nationals of 19 countries (so far) in a move reminiscent of the "Muslim Ban" enacted during the first Trump administration. [The Interfaith Immigration Coalition denounced the restrictions](#) in a press release that included a quote from MCC U.S. Executive Director Ann Graber Hershberger lamenting reduced opportunities for collaboration and learning across cultures.
- **Foreign assistance cuts:** on May 30, the White House [requested additional funding cuts](#) to the international affairs budget, especially for lifesaving humanitarian assistance, including food, medical and humanitarian aid.
- **Rescissions package:** on June 4, the White House sent a [Rescissions Package](#) to Congress, requesting a clawback of over \$9 billion in appropriated funding for lifesaving humanitarian assistance including food, peacebuilding, and poverty-focused development assistance. It passed the House on June 12 by a vote of 214-212. The Senate is expected to take up the bill in July.
- **Judge delays transfer of Oak Flat to Resolution Copper:** on June 6, a federal judge ruled that the transfer of the [Apache sacred land](#) of Oak Flat to Resolution Copper will not happen immediately upon the [release of the Final Environmental Impact Statement \(FEIS\)](#). The public will have until August 19 to review the FEIS and bring forward legal cases. Watch the [Save Oak Flat Webinar recording](#) to learn more.

## Landback: an Indigenous Jubilee

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“Landback is the process of returning land to Indigenous peoples. Returning land is important because Indigenous peoples are systematically excluded from land ownership — the primary vehicle for accumulating security and wealth in the United States. Indigenous peoples feel accountable as the land’s first caretakers. Landback, or rematriation, honors our unique role as land and water protectors. The Coalition to Dismantle the Doctrine of Discovery launched a landback fund in November. It began when one of our members, Meghan, purchased a house. She asked how she could acknowledge that buying land is a privilege and that the home she purchased is on land unjustly taken from Indigenous peoples. She suggested that she could voluntarily impose a tax on the purchase and that we could encourage others who want to acknowledge the impact of settler colonialism to do the same. Most of the time, only people with property or significant wealth participate in landback. Meghan invited us to a vision where small donations from many people would be pooled and given to Indigenous partners who could then buy land.” **Read the rest of Sarah Augustine’s article for the *Anabaptist World* [here](#).**

## Faithful stewardship nurtures sustainable haven in Hokkaido

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It’s lambing season at [Menno Village](#), a farm in Hokkaido, Japan. The flock of sheep, which will soon swell to 100 head, has been rebuilding soil fertility in the degraded and compacted rice fields through an adaptive grazing system. This year the sheep have another job: to produce wool that will be used as insulation in a new retreat building — *Hitsuji* House. *Hitsuji*, the word for sheep in the Japanese language, symbolizes not just an educational space about sheep but also a spiritual journey with the Good Shepherd, explains Raymond Epp, who, alongside his wife Akiko Aratani, has nurtured this land for 30 years, is their vision for the next phase of their lives. **Read the rest of Jane Morrow’s article for Mennonite Mission Network [here](#).**

# Mennonite Action June Mass Call Re-Cap

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As grief for the violent world around us weighs heavy on our hearts, it was powerful to gather with hundreds of you on our June Mass Call to center queer wisdom and joy. To mark Pride Month together, we heard from speakers who shared the power of queerness in the Mennonite Church, and discussed the role that memory and radical queer imagination can play in shaping our world into a Kin-dom of God. **If you missed the call, you can watch a recording [here](#). - **Interfaith Action For Palestine:** This year, Mennonite Action will once again join the Interfaith Action Coalition for Palestine from June 29 - July 1 in the D.C. area. In person registration has closed, but you can join for online programming throughout the mobilization by signing up [here](#).
- **North Carolina Training Ahead of MennoCon:** Mennonite Action is [holding a national organizing training in Raleigh, NC](#) preceding Mennonite Convention. The training will open with a worship service and gathering in the evening of Sunday, July 6th, and will continue with an all-day training on public action and grassroots organizing on Monday, July 7th.
- **Kitchener-Waterloo Peace Retreat:** From July 11-13, [Mennonite Action Kitchener-Waterloo is hosting a three-day peacebuilding retreat](#) with Palestinian and Israeli peace activists Aziz Abu Sarah and Maoz Inon. Participants will learn stories from Maoz and Aziz and learn skills to help with on-going organizing in North America.
- **Apache Stronghold:** [All are invited to the final, all-hands-on-deck ceremonial gathering at Oak Flat on July 19-20.](#) This is 30 days before the land transfer to Resolution Copper, and we ask folks to join in prayer together at this time.
- **Financial Support to make this summer possible:** Mennonite Action is \$30,000 away from our \$50,000 summer fundraising goal. We are asking individuals and churches to help contribute to help us reach this collective goal, which will fund all of the solidarity, training, and action work that Mennonite Action has planned for the coming months. 
