



Was I Anabaptist all along?

My journey from Catholic lay minister to Mennonite pastor.

"In 2011, I declared during a stroll with a friend, 'If I am going to call myself a disciple of Jesus, I want it to mean something!' I was expressing a concern dear to the early Anabaptists: Rather than merely worshiping Jesus or declaring Christian faith with words, can I try, imperfectly, to emulate Jesus' life in the way I live? Can we? My journey to Anabaptism has been circuitous. I'm told I was baptized Lutheran as an infant (I don't remember it!). The short life and death of Aline Al-Mahalawi

"I have known Aline's family for almost 20 years. I first met her uncle, Amgad, when he was on the staff of Al-Najd Developmental Forum, and I was the director of the Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) United Nations Office. On almost-annual visits, Amgad would escort the MCC staff traveling from Jerusalem, Washington, Ottawa and the UN to meet the Palestinian families who were <u>raising rabbits</u> or planting gardens with help from Al-Najd and MCC. It has personally been quite difficult to learn the painful details of the struggle of one family and to feel so powerless to end this genocide. I have been candid with Amgad; I have not been able to stop this war, but I have shared the pain and suffering of his family with my family and friends who have promised to pray for his family and do what they can to end this genocide." **Read the rest of Doug Hostetter's article for the** Anabaptist World here.

Partnership permits churches in Africa and North America to share gifts

Benin Bible Institute (BBI), a Mennonite Mission Network partner, and Waterford Mennonite Church (WMC) have been part of one another's ministries for 22 years. A highlight of this partnership is the annual visit between the faculty and staff of the Bible school, in Cotonou, Benin, and members of the congregation, in Goshen, Indiana. One year, a Beninese delegation travels to the United States — and to another partner congregation, St. Jacobs Mennonite Church in Ontario, Canada — and the following year, Waterford representatives travel to Benin. Cindy Voth, WMC's lead pastor, said that the BBI-WMC partnership reminds the congregation that it is part of Christ's global body. "It helps keep us in a posture of curiosity and learning. ...
