# WORSHIP THIS SUNDAY 9:30 AM

This Sunday, Lauren Satchwell will preach a sermon titled "a likeness like..." using Ezekiel 1:1-28.

Think about the prophet Ezekiel's encounters with God. They weren't quiet, intellectual exercises. They were powerful, sensory-overloading experiences of God's glory—flashing lights, loud sounds, and visions of overwhelming power. Or consider the Tabernacle worship God commanded for the Israelites, with its specific aromas of incense, rich visual symbolism, and ritualistic actions. God has always used the physical world to communicate spiritual truths. This Sunday, we're diving into the Sensate pathway, one of the nine spiritual dispositions identified by author Gary Thomas. This pathway teaches us that for some, the most direct path to God is through what they see, hear, taste, touch, and smell. For Sensates, worship is an entire body experience. And for the rest of us, it's an invitation to rediscover a more holistic, embodied faith.

Goshen College fights for the safety of its immigrant students.

At Goshen College, we are fighting to create spaces of safety in which our immigrant students and their families can learn while healing from the trauma of immigration. At this moment, federal and state governments are ramping up efforts to detain and deport immigrants. As a college, there are many external circumstances and forces that we do not control. But we also recognize our calling as Mennonite leaders and educators to:

- craft conversations that do not increase animosity;
- · complexify the dominant narratives with human stories; and
- create as much safety as possible for the immigrants who enrich our campus, our city and our regional workforce.

### learning to listen

As a co-director of Mennonite Men, it feels important to get to know Mennonite males from around the country and reflect on unique and shared experiences. Turns out that traveling to the far reaches of the US is not so affordable. And while phone and Zoom calls aren't quite the same as meeting in-person, they are great ways to listen to, share with, and learn from other men working at being followers of Jesus for God's shalom. I recently had a virtual conversation with a fellow Mennonite male in Idaho, Rob Hanson, thanks to an introduction from contacts in Pacific Northwest Mennonite Conference. Rather quickly I discovered Rob and I share several passions including conservation, agriculture, soil, and forests. God's creation clearly means a lot to Rob. But I also sensed Rob's care for relationships and the well-being of people as well as concerns about violence and poverty in the world. Rob is part of a bagel breakfast men's group with other men in the congregation where he attends in Boise, Hyde Park Mennonite Fellowship. It's easy to see why phrases like "burning the candle at both ends" and "burned out" have become commonplace. Friends, this is not the life God has called us to. This is not the life that God models. ### Oregon church cleaning up after arson

Zion Mennonite Church in Hubbard, Ore., was back to holding worship services in its sanctuary Aug. 10 after someone broke into the church the evening of Aug. 2 and started a fire inside. Malachi Samuel Kercher, 20, was arrested at the church that evening and faces arson, criminal mischief and burglary charges. Zion Pastor Steve Bomar said worship was canceled Aug. 3 for police and fire investigations, but the congregation was back to meeting for its regularly scheduled service a week later, without adult Sunday school and other meetings.
