This Sunday, Kevin Chupp will preach a sermon titled "Does Your Work Give You Joy?" using Galatians 6:1-10.






Congregational and Pastoral Review




MCN 50th



On September 26, 1976, First Mennonite Church (Normal) and Bloomington Mennonite Church met separately one final time and voted unanimously to merge to form Mennonite Church of Normal. After that came our building and many other accomplishments, moments of celebration and grief, and acts of service and outreach among many other things. As we begin our 50th year as a church, we will celebrate this milestone with a Celebration Sunday on **September 27**th, **2026**.

In preparation, we are looking to form a committee to plan and coordinate the 50th year celebration. MCN 50th Factoids

Bite-sized pieces of our shared history leading up to our 50th anniversary celebration (September 27, 2026).

One of the biggest changes in recent years at MCN is our structure, which was changed in part to empower lay leadership in a non-hierarchical way. This still feels new to many of us, but has deep roots. Back in 1986, Central District Conference Minister Mark Weidner described pastor James Waltner's approach as "leading others into ministry rather than doing it all himself." Rachel Waltner Goosen described his role as a "diplomat" who worked at encouraging, drawing people together, while interpreting and communicating new ideas that came from within the community. Thank you to all who joined our September Mass Call last week! There were so many powerful stories shared about the work happening across North America, and looking ahead to what's to come. You can watch the recording of the call here, for those who missed it. On the call, we had the chance to hear more about:

- <u>"To Build Our Courage" U.S. Tour</u>, which begins in just over a week! If you haven't yet registered, we'd love to have you find your nearest stop and be a part of it. We'll break bread together, hold worship services, and dive into critical training sessions to prepare your church to meet this moment– so <u>register</u> today!
- **DC Arrest Action** earlier this month, MA members refused to leave Sen. Mark Warner's office until the senator publicly called for an end to Israel's genocide, the latest coordinated effort in our civil disobedience. Hearing about their experience anchors us in our resolve to reject complicity, even as it requires our courage. You can read more about this **peaceful act of civil disobedience**.
- Other updates from across the organization, from this month's online Courage School and how participants in Asheville leveraged the curriculum, to updates on community members detained by ICE.

As a community, we are seeking to testify of a God whose love transcends borders, who dismantles the systems of genocide and rejects the disenfranchisement of our neighbors. As Christian Nationalism seems to be on the rise around us, our time together anchors us in our Mennonite faith and nonviolent resistance. Thank you for your faithful witness in this work.

Virginia church encourages voting to love

Yard sign and magnet project a gentle reminder of how actions impact neighbors. As the U.S. presidential election divided neighbors and families last fall, Dorothy Shank felt the conviction of Jesus' teaching in Luke 10 that the most important commandments are to love God and love neighbors. Dismayed by the fraught political and social climate, she wondered how she could offer a different perspective. The phrase that came to her was, "Vote to Love Your Neighbor." Shank brought this idea to Ridgeway Mennonite Church in Harrisonburg, Va., and her congregation embraced it, ordering the first batch of yard signs and car magnets bearing those words on Sept. 16, 2024. The message invites people to pause and consider how everyday votes can be a witness of faith. Beyond elections, individuals and groups "vote" in daily actions and decisions — from which products to buy at which grocery store to simply getting to know the people living in the neighborhood. Opening Doors at Immanuel Mennonite Church

In 2023, eleven members of Immanuel Mennonite Church in Harrisonburg, VA, gathered several times to conduct an accessibility audit of our church. This audit led to several straightforward yet impactful changes to make our church spaces more accessible, such as replacing round doorknobs with lever handles to facilitate easier opening. Our largest project was undertaken the following year. It focused on improving the accessibility of our church entrance for people who may have trouble entering the building without assistance. We already had a gently sloped concrete walkway that leads from street parking spaces and connects to a curb cut. At the building end of this walkway, however, there was a short, narrow, metal ramp over the entrance threshold and a fairly heavy front door, both of which posed accessibility challenges. To address these, we applied for and were awarded an Anabaptist Disabilities Network (ADN) Barrier Free Grant, which allowed us to help make two significant improvements. **Read the rest of Chris Moore's blog post for Anabaptist Disabilities Network here.**

SADRA's Women in Peacebuilding works to dismantle violence in South Africa

In August, Southern African Development and Reconstruction Agency (SADRA), a Mennonite Mission Network partner, celebrated women's month by reflecting on the work done by SADRA's Women in Peacebuilding, with focus on the impactful work of conflict mediators trained between 2024-2025. The Women in Peacebuilding initiative follows in the footsteps of the Women's March on Aug. 9, 1956, when more than 20,000 women marched to the seat of governmental power in Pretoria, South Africa in a historic embodiment of unity, resilience, and strength to protest the systemic oppression of apartheid.
